 - Subcommittee updates Information
 - Legislative Committee – worked on updating existing Legislative Agenda one pager.
 - Past President Committee – worked on info sheet for new members and outreach.
 - Both committees discussed ideas for the use of the “Study Money”.

 - Study funding updates Information
 - Ideas considered:
 - ROW – fees for utilities use of the ROW, based on King Co's position that held up in court, possible development of model code. Legal to assess applicability

 - Workgroup/agency updates Information/Direction
 - (IIJA, Broadband, LSC, Grants, CABT, PWB, FBRB, CRAB, Local Programs, FMSIB)
 - Final Memo sent out to the Board related to the IIJA outcome and will be made available to WSACE membership. (Note final memo was provided to membership on 9/28)

Broadband Comm met and discussed recommending pilot projects with possible funding to test the concept, also discussed model code development as a tool for agencies.

Coalition Against Bigger Trucks – reached out about a possible study area in the PNW

Public Works Board and Brian Abbot Fish Barrier Removal Board – discussed Legislative ask and support.

FMSIB – Chair Fey is proposing legislative changes, more to come.

 - Legislative Priorities/Agency proposals (WSDOT, 811, BRPELS) Information/Direction
WSDOT – Franchise language, WSDOT can't use gas tax to move utilities, impacts discussed.
811 – subtle changes, comments from Scott Yeager helped steer changes
Licensing Board – testing requirements – no concerns
